

Guide to downloading and installing Dorico

1. Download Dorico from our website here: https://www.steinberg.net/index.php?id=15006&L=1

Download the 'Application Installer' and the 'Sounds Installer' for either Mac or Windows.

You can optionally download the Version History PDF as it contains lots of useful information.

You can also get all Steinberg installers using the Steinberg Download Assistant, (<u>www.steinberg.net/sda</u>). SDA enables downloads to continue where they left off if there is a break in your internet connection during the download.

- **2.** Run **both** installers to install Dorico and then also the sounds. The Dorico installation also includes the Steinberg eLicenser Control Center, which handles the licensing.
- From your applications list on your computer, run the eLicenser Control Center, (and if asked, run the maintenance task) then click on the green 'Enter Activation Code' button and enter the code that was provided with this document. (If you don't have a code, please contact your Steinberg representative.)
- 4. Run Dorico.
